To receive your 2017 license, please provide a copy of your pet's updated rabies vaccination papers with the correct fee (either \$5.25 or \$10.25) to Village Hall at 352 High Street. After April 1st a penalty will be assessed against the owner of such dogs in the amount of \$25.00, in addition to a \$5.00 late fee and license fee for each eligible dog not licensed. 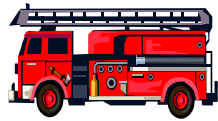

Household Clean-Up Day

The annual household clean-up day will occur on **Wednesday, May 24th**. Please have your items at the curb by 5:00 a.m.

Items collected at no charge include furniture, carpet, mattresses, appliances, push mowers, bikes and electronics with the exception of TV's and computer monitors. Call for current rates for TV's and computer monitors. Tires, TV's and computer monitors will need a tag in order to be collected at the curb. Tags can be purchased at Village Hall or the Wastewater Treatment Plant for a fee.

If you place an item at the curb that has a reservoir for a liquid, please remove the liquid or we will not pick it up. We will pick up small amounts of lumber and paneling, less than a pickup truck load. Nails and screws should be removed or pounded over. All broken glass should be contained and not loose. Please place metal items in a separate pile. Batteries will be collected at no charge. We **will not** pick up cardboard, magazines, books, fuels, paints, thinners or solvents. There will be regular curbside collection on Thursday, May 25th. Please call DPW with questions at 920-532-0434. Thanks!

Deduct Meters

Every year around the 4th of July Holiday, Officers have to respond to complaints of fireworks going off. Some of those result in a response from Emergency Medical Services and/or the Fire Department. Most people claim ignorance on the fact that the fireworks that they use are illegal. Others say that they bought them from stands in Wisconsin so they must be legal. That is not the case. Wisconsin does not really regulate what can be sold to the general public, which is why many from other states come here to get them. To shoot off fireworks in the Village, you need a permit. That permit can be obtained from the Village of Wrightstown Fire Chief. A good rule of thumb is if what you are setting off explodes or leaves the ground, you need a permit. Let's all have a great and safe summer!

Weight Limits

Because of the unusual winter we've had and the amount of frost in the ground, the start date for enforcing weight limits will be February 20, 2017 and the end date will be determined as the weather permits. Please call 532-0434 for information.

Meter Testing

Some residents will receive notices or phone calls from the Village of Wrightstown's water department regarding water meter replacement. The utility is being required to install a new meter constructed of a new material in lieu of the new EPA requirements. Along with this meter change there will also be a more extensive cross connection inspection done. This will include all point sources, which is any place that water is dispensed. This will include all rooms in a residence that have water fixtures (bathrooms, kitchens, laundry rooms and basements). This process is required by state plumbing codes NR 811, COMM 82-84, and DNR code 810.15. Staff will try to make this seamless and lessen the amount of inconvenience as much as possible. Please contact the water department as soon as possible. This contact and communication is very important and scheduling can be very flexible. We understand scheduling can be a challenge, but we need confirmation that you recognize our need to maintain our utilities. Please call 920-532-0434 to schedule an appointment or communicate that you will try to fit us into your schedule.

Now that the snow is going away and grass is getting green, we begin the switch to warmer weather. Please take time to check your smoke and CO alarm batteries when the clock change occurs to "Spring Forward". The Fire Department has been busy as usual keeping up with training. We will be doing "Live Fire" trainings on a house within the rural suburban village limits that's going to be torn down starting in April and through early June; so if you see smoke and/or flames and fire trucks repeatedly at the same location, you understand its "training" and a rare excellent opportunity we don't normally have anymore.

Leak Awareness



The Villages' Water Utility has a leak detection program in place which helps them account for every gallon of water pumped. You can help by being aware of a few things that possibly mean a leak: Reduced water pressure, sump pump running more often than usual, water running down the curb, unusual sound or vibration coming from your water line. If any of these signs are present, please call our DPW office @ 920-532-0434.

Curbside Chipping

Curbside chipping will begin this year on Thursday, April 13, 2017 and occur every other Thursday consistent with the curbside recycling schedule. Branches up to 4" in diameter should be placed at the curb. Ends should be facing the curb, not obstructing the sidewalk, gutter or street. Brush piles are to be limited to 4' in height by 25' in length. Piles exceeding 4' x 25' will be chipped and invoiced for the entire pile at the current rate for labor and equipment with a half hour minimum charge, and fifteen minute increments thereafter. If you don't want to be charged for chipping, please ensure your pile does not exceed 4' x 25'. Any brush cut by contractors will not be chipped by village crews. Your contractor is responsible for disposing of any branches. Please contact DPW if you would like a load of wood chips.

Meters are available to customers in permanent or fixed installation as well as portable or temporary. These meters measure water that is used outside the home where sewer treatment of the water is not needed. This measured water amount is deducted from the sewer charge. There is an installation fee for permanent meters as well as a quarterly charge. The portable meters accrue charges by the month for the time it is rented. These meters are available upon request at the Utilities Department. Please contact the office at 920-532-0434 to pick up a portable meter or requirements for a permanent one. **Reminder: 1,244 gallons of water must be used per month to recover the cost of the meter rental fee of \$15.00.**

Water Main Flushing

Spring water main flushing will take place from Tuesday, April 25th thru Friday, April 28th between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please refrain from using water for about one hour if you see flushing in your area. Flushing removes natural minerals such as iron and calcium, which are harmless, but may discolor your water. If you notice discoloration, please flush your faucets through the Cold tap only until it is clear. We apologize for any inconvenience that you may have. Please call 920-532-0434 with questions.

Stray Animals

What should you do when you come across a Stray/Lost/Wandering Animal?

Observe the animal for any unusual behavior. Do not attempt to capture if unusual behavior is observed. Call the Police Department at 920-532-6007 (press 1 and follow the prompts).

If no unusual behavior is observed and you choose to capture the animal, please call the Police Department at 920-532-6007 (press 1 and follow the prompts). Do not take the animal to the shelter on your own. If you choose not to capture the animal, please give the Police Department a call to let us know where the animal is or was last seen.

If the animal is wearing an I.D. or Rabies tag, check the tag for owner contact information. All dogs are required to be licensed per State Statute. Many animals that are not wearing tags are implanted with a microchip, a permanent form of identification. Our local veterinary clinic has a scanner to read the chip. The owner information can be traced from the microchip number.
