## Deduct Meters (Lawn Watering Meters)

Meters are available to customers in permanent or fixed installation as well as portable or temporary. These meters measure water that is used outside the home where sewer treatment of the water is not needed. This measured water amount is deducted from the sewer charge. There is an installation fee for permanent meters as well as a quarterly charge. The portable meters accrue charges by the month for the time it is rented. These meters are available upon request at the Utilities Department. Please contact the office at 920-532-0434 to pick up a portable meter or requirements for a permanent one.



## Police Department

Please slow down in the Village. Kids are out of school for the summer and the weather is finally clearing up enough for people to enjoy all that the Village has to offer.

Please remain cognizant of the speed limits throughout the Village and be aware of children, bike riders, pedestrians and other recreationists.

During the summer months and into the fall, please be aware of the construction zones. Fines are doubled in those zones. Stay alert and pay attention to signage for direction.

Lastly, Ordinance 139-19 is the Village of Wrightstown Curfew Ordinance. It states that those under the age of 18 "shall not loiter, idle, wander or play either on foot or in a vehicle upon the streets, alleys, highways, roads, sidewalks, parks, playgrounds, public grounds, vacant lots or other unsupervised places in the Village between 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM unless accompanied by a parent, guardian, or other adult person having care and custody of the minor." Parents, guardians, or other adults having care and custody of these minors can also be held accountable for allowing such activity. ## Lawn/Weed Control

Our ordinance – Chapter 130-3 states that weeds/grass/vegetation over 12" on a vacant lot and 8" on a developed lot constitutes a public nuisance. If it is determined that the height of weeds, grasses or other vegetation exceeds the limits, the DPW Staff will cut the noxious weeds, grasses or vegetation and charge the expenses to the property owner. We would like to thank the responsible property owners in the Village of Wrightstown for helping us make the community so beautiful.

## Light Bulbs



**Did You Know?** Compact fluorescent light bulbs are an energy-saving alternative to incandescent bulbs – they produce the same amount of light, use one third of the electricity, and last up to ten times as long. LED bulbs can last even longer with even lower energy usage. It is also safe to put old incandescent bulbs in the trash.

**Note:** The Hazardous Material Recovery Facility is temporarily offering additional residential collection hours. Starting Tuesday, June 5<sup>th</sup>, the HMRF will be open on Tuesdays from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm, in addition to the regular hours of Thursdays from 12:00 Noon to 6:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. This will be a pilot program.

## Property Assessments

The Village is undergoing a total revaluation of the assessment records and values. The Village Assessor, Mike Denor, and his sons, Joe & Paul, are completing the project. The process of a total revaluation requires the assessor to view the interior of all homes and businesses, as well as verifying exterior measurements of all buildings. Inspections will begin this July. Work will start in the northeast part of the Village and continue in a clockwise direction. Property owners will receive a letter in the mail asking to schedule an appointment. When the assessor arrives at your home, he will have proper identification. The objective of the revaluation is to assure that all real estate is valued fairly and to identify changes in value that have occurred over the years. Value can change due to physical deterioration, improvements that may have occurred, and the change to market conditions. The revaluation project will be completed by July of 2018. The 2018 assessment notices will be mailed in August and the Board of Review will be about 30 days after the notices are sent. There will be open book sessions prior to the Board of Review if you wish to discuss the new assessed value as well as answer any questions you might have.



## Fire Department

We remind you the Village has an ordinance on fireworks within the Village. You will be given citations for violations of the code. Please be respectful to your neighbors and the people and pets who fireworks are found to be a problem. Also please keep your campfire under control. Nothing puts a damper on the fun of sitting around a campfire on your property as a call for the FD to put out a fire that got out of control or inadvertently started a fire elsewhere.

## Yard Waste

Branches and brush are chipped curbside on recycling Thursdays. Grass clippings, leaves, and garden waste are accepted at the compost site located on Van Dyke Street. **Please do not place your yard waste in your garbage or recycling cart. Banned from WI landfills since 1993, placing yard waste in your refuse container violates WI State Statutes Chapter 287 and Wrightstown Municipal Code Chapter 165.** Responsible dumping and efforts of tidiness are appreciated to ensure longevity of the site and to help with maintenance costs associated with the compost site. Contractors working in the village are not allowed to dump at the site, as are no branches allowed at the compost site. The solid waste container that is located at the site is for disposal of garbage bags used to transport leaves and grass clippings. Please empty all bags as it is unacceptable to leave grass clippings or leaves in bags.
