Deduct Meters -

Lawn Watering Meters

Meters are available to customers in permanent or fixed installation as well as portable or temporary. These meters measure water that is used outside the home where sewer treatment of the water is not needed. This measured water amount is deducted from the sewer charge. There is an installation fee for permanent meters as well as a quarterly charge. The portable meters accrue charges by the month for the time it is rented. These meters are available upon request at the Utilities Department. Please contact the office at 920-532-0434 to pick up a portable meter or requirements for a permanent one.

Summer Recycling Tips

As the weather heats up and the days grow longer, we spend more time outside soaking up sun and enjoying the outdoors. While we are enjoying summer trips, barbecues and pool time lets reduce waste. Here are a few summer recycling tips:

- At a summer barbecue or picnic, make recycling convenient by putting a clearly labeled recycling bin by the trash can. Wrightstown accepts "mixed" recycling therefore cans, plastic, glass and cardboard can be combined. Don't forget to recycle empty ketchup, mustard, BBQ sauce and other grilling favorites with twist-off lids. Rinse and Recycle!
- Think "green" when summer entertaining. Here are some things to keep in mind. Paper and/or foam disposable plates, napkins and cutlery are *not* recyclable. Consider springing for a set of reusable picnicware or purchase paper products, party supplies and decorations that are made of recycled materials or are biodegradable.
- Heading out to a summer sporting event or taking a road trip? Don't leave home without your reusable water bottle. Summer heat calls for extra hydration. Use a refillable bottle when possible, but if it's not, be sure to recycle your plastic drink containers. *Did you know*? Each day, people in the U.S throw away more than 60 million plastic water bottles, most of which end in landfills or as litter in America's streets, parks and waterways.
- With sunshine comes mowing the grass. So don't let those grass clippings end up in the landfill! The EPA estimates that yard waste accounts for 18% of our landfills. Yard waste is *not* acceptable in trash carts. Wrightstown offers a convenient drop off location for your grass clippings and yard waste. The compost site is located at 409 Van Dyke Street.
- Repurpose old beach and pool accessories. Most beach and pool toys are made out of PVC therefore are *not* recyclable. Try finding other uses for them or patching holes before throwing them away. If you are shopping for new pool and summer toys, buy those made from recyclable materials to minimize the ecological impact.
- Kids are out of school, and summer is one of the most popular times for vacations. Just because you're on vacation or out of your normal routine doesn't mean you should take a "vacation" from recycling. If you're traveling by car, be sure to bring along two bags to collect and separate garbage and recycling and then properly dispose of at rest stops.

Please slow down in the Village. Kids are out of school for the summer and the weather is finally clearing up enough for people to enjoy all that the Village has to offer. Please remain cognizant of the speed limits throughout the Village and be

Lastly, Ordinance 139-19 is the Village of Wrightstown Curfew Ordinance. It states that those under the age of 18 "shall not loiter, idle, wander or play either on foot or in a vehicle upon the streets, alleys, highways, roads, sidewalks, parks, playgrounds, public grounds, vacant lots or other unsupervised places in the Village between 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM unless accompanied by a parent, guardian, or other adult person having care and custody of the minor." Parents, guardians, or other adults having care and custody of these minors can also be held accountable for allowing such activity. Annual Water Main Flushing Notice

Water main flushing will occur **Monday, July 8th - Wednesday, July 10th**. Flushing removes natural minerals such as iron and calcium, which are harmless, but may discolor water. Check your water for clarity before washing clothes. If water looks discolored, flush through with cold tap water only.

Lawn/Weed Control


Our ordinance – Chapter 130-3 states that weeds/grass/vegetation over 12" on a vacant lot and 8" on a developed lot constitutes a public nuisance. If it is determined that the height of weeds, grasses or other vegetation exceeds the limits, the DPW Staff will cut the noxious weeds, grasses or vegetation and charge the expenses to the property owner. We would like to thank the responsible property owners in the Village of Wrightstown for helping us make the community so beautiful.

Yard Waste

Branches and brush are chipped curbside on recycling Thursdays. Grass clippings, leaves, and garden waste are accepted at the compost site located on Van Dyke Street. Please do not place your yard waste in your garbage or recycling cart. Banned from WI landfills since 1993, placing yard waste in your refuse container violates WI State Statutes Chapter 287 and Wrightstown Municipal Code Chapter 165. Responsible dumping and efforts of tidiness are appreciated to ensure longevity of the site and to help with maintenance costs associated with the compost site. Contractors working in the village are not allowed to dump at the site, as are no branches allowed at the compost site. The solid waste container that is located at the site is for disposal of garbage bags used to transport leaves and grass clippings. Please empty all bags as it is unacceptable to leave grass clippings or leaves in bags.

Household Clean-Up Day Summary

The Public Works Department and Deyo Disposal worked hard to pick-up all items at the curbside in a timely matter. Over 35 tons of solid waste was collected this year which is almost double previous years. *That's a lot of trash*! 35 tons = 70,000 lbs or the weight of an average battle tank.
