Annual Household Clean-up Day Wednesday - May 26th

- Please have your items at the curb by 5:00 am, Wednesday May 26th.
- Examples of items collected at no charge include: furniture, carpet, mattresses, appliances, push mowers, bikes, and other general household items.
- TV's, computer monitors and tires have additional recycling fees and required curbside pick-up tag and payment. Tags can be purchased at the Village Hall or Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- Small amounts of construction waste (less than a pickup truck load) will be accepted. Nails and screws should be removed or pounded over.
- Please place any metal items on a separate pile.
- Glass items should be contained.
- Batteries will be collected at no charge.
- Items *not accepted*: cardboard, bulk recyclables, magazines, books, fuels, paints, thinners, solvents or hazardous chemicals.
- Please remember this service is for *Village Residents Only* and should not be used for other communities to drop off their items. If the volumes continue to increase due to additional garbage being brought in from outside village limits or residents not obeying guidelines, this no charge curbside service may be discontinued.

Seasonal Street Weight Limits

In efforts to protect village roads from the spring thaw, seasonal weight restrictions went into effect on Monday, March 8. The restrictions will most likely be in place for most of March, dependent on the weather. If you should have any further questions, please call our Public Works Department.

Curbside Brush Chipping

Curbside chipping will begin this year on Thursday, April 8th and occur every other Thursday consistent with the curbside recycling schedule. Branches up to 4" in diameter are accepted for curbside chipping. Ends should be facing the curb, not obstructing the sidewalk, gutter or street. Brush piles are to be limited to 4' in height by 25' in length. Piles exceeding 4' x 25' will be chipped and invoiced for the entire pile at the current rate for labor and equipment with a half hour minimum charge, and fifteen minute increments thereafter. If you don't want to be charged for chipping, please ensure your pile does not exceed 4' x 25'. Any brush cut by contractors will not be chipped by Village crews. Your contractor is responsible for disposing of any branches. Please contact DPW if you would like a load of wood chips.

Leak Awareness

The Village's Water Utility has a leak detection program in place which helps them account for every gallon of water pumped. You can help by being aware of a few things that possibly mean a leak: Reduced water pressure, sump pump running more often than usual, water running down the curb, unusual sound or vibration coming from your water line. If any of these signs are present, please call the Public Works office.

Meter Replacements

Village wide water meter replacements continue and some residents will receive notices or phone calls from the Village of Wrightstown's Water Department regarding water meter replacements. The utility is required to install new meters constructed of a new material in response to the new EPA requirements. Along with this meter change, the Utility Department will complete a cross connection inspection. This will include all point sources, which is any place that water is dispensed. This will include all rooms in a residence that have water fixtures (bathrooms, kitchens, laundry rooms, basements and outside faucets). This process is required by the state plumbing codes NR 811, COMM 82-84, and DNR code 810.15. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Deduct Meters

Meters are available to customers in permanent or fixed installation as well as portable or temporary. These meters measure water that is used outside the home where sewer treatment of the water is not needed. This measured water amount is deducted from the sewer charge. There is an installation fee for permanent meters as well as a quarterly charge. The portable meters accrue charges by the month from the time it is rented. These meters are available upon request at the Utilities Department. Please contact the office at 920-532-0434 to pick up a portable meter or requirements for a permanent one. Reminder: 1,244 gallons of water must be used per month to recover the cost of the meter rental fee of \$15.00.
