Community Update—

Brown County South Landfill Town of Holland—1258 County Road IL

After a year of getting the site prepped for construction, the Brown County South Landfill is in full building mode. The 26-acre cell has been dug out and crews are currently installing the clay and synthetic liner. The clay and synthetic liner go through hundreds of tests to ensure proper clay compaction and synthetic liner seam sealing during construction. Crews are working on the construction of a residential drop off area and the scale house. The scale house will include two in-bound scales and routine trucks visiting the landfill will be equipped with an RFID tag unique to each vehicle. Construction of a 160,000-gallon leachate tank is also underway. The South Landfill is on budget and on task to be ready to open in January 2022.

ATV/UTV/GOLF CARTS PROHIBITED

Current State Law and Village Ordinances prohibit the use of ATV/UTV/GOLF CARTS or any unregistered motorized vehicle on any street, or any property other than property zoned rural residential in the Village of Wrightstown. Many of the Townships and Municipalities around us have implemented Ordinances allowing the use of ATV's/UTV's. The Village is in the process of looking into an Ordinance to allow these vehicles. Until the decision by Village Board is made, ATV/UTV/Golf Carts or any other unregistered motorized vehicles are prohibited in the Village of Wrightstown.

The Chief of Police has been tasked with researching and creating a draft of an Ordinance to present to Village Board. We have reached out to Trail Ambassador's, Department of Transportation, Department of Natural Resources, other police agencies, and community members for their input. The process is taking quite a bit of time, but we want to give quality information to Village Board so they can make an educated decision. We hope to have a draft for this Ordinance to Village Board in the very near future.

Sump Pump Discharge

Reminder – From November 1st to March 31st every homeowner who has a sump pump discharge through a curb-cut or a hose that discharges directly to the curb & gutter will have to redirect the discharge elsewhere on the homeowner's property.

Seasonal Reminder

For your protection, please remove all outside garden hoses and shut off your outside water taps to prevent freezing. It's a good practice to periodically check your exterior and interior water lines and fixtures to ensure no leaks are taking place. Any water losses on your property are your responsibility and will be billed accordingly, no adjustments will be considered.

If you rented a seasonal deduct meter, please don't forget to return the meter back to the Water Utility department.

Curbside Chipping/Yard Waste Disposal

The last day for curbside branch chipping is November 4th. The Village's Yard Waste/Compost Site located at 409 Van Dyke St. will remain open for disposal of grass clippings, leaves, garden waste as well as branches/brush (no larger than 4" diameter) until weather permits. Please dispose of waste in proper bins as well as following the standard guidelines. Stumps/roots, fire wood, stones, dirt are not accepted. If using plastic bags or bins to transport waste, please empty and properly dispose of the bags.

The village is not able to offer curbside pickup of leaves but watch in upcoming newsletters for curbside Christmas tree pick up dates.

Fall Waste & Recycling

Utilize the Yard Waste:

Autumn leaves provide colorful scenic views. Mulching and composting your fallen leaves is a terrific way to recycle and create a rich garden soil. Learn more about composting online or at the local library. Village residents can also drop off leaves at the Village Compost Site. These leaves are then mulched and spread onto a local field which provides excellent nutrients to the soil for the following crop season. Fact: Did you know that leaves are a leading contributor of phosphorus in our waters. Properly cleaning up your yard in the Fall will help keep our local waters and storm drains clean.

Halloween!

Dressing up, decorating the porch, sneaking too much candy are just some of the ways to enjoy Halloween. Create your own Halloween costumes with old clothing and craft supplies you have at home or head to a local thrift store to purchase used clothing and accessories. Check out social media and community networks if they have past Halloween costumes that would be suitable for you and your family.

Repurpose items you have around to decorate for the season. Crates, mason jars maybe an old window or bucket that have been laying in the back shed. Have fun, get creative and crafty.
