

IT'S A SHAM...DON'T GIVE INTO SCAMS



Scammers have become very sophisticated in the ways they steel your identity and your money with the use of telephone (cell phones), mail and computers. The Wrightstown Police Department receives numerous complaints of scams monthly. Residents have come in with checks, via mail, for thousands of dollars to cash. Doing so and spending the money will leave you with insufficient funds and put you in a bad situation. Residents have also come in with "official" looking letters with letterheads that look like the company but just a bit off to send them money.

Other residents are receiving phone calls indicating their grandchild was arrested and they need to post the bond by credit card over the phone. Or, they will be asked to go to the store and buy gift cards and scratch off the back to expose the PIN number and give them to the caller.

Residents are getting "pop ups" on their computers indicating that Pornography was found on their computer and the FBI will be going after them unless they follow certain instructions online, which involves giving out personal information and credit card or bank information. Folks, if you are looking up illegal pornography, the FBI will not be contacting you by a "pop up" on your computer. They will "pop up" at your front door with a warrant. Other "pop ups" will say there is a virus on your computer and to follow links to sanitize your computer. Don't do it!!! If you feel there are viruses on your computer, get them removed by a trustworthy company.

Sadly, the Wrightstown Police Department has taken reports of residents being scammed out of a couple hundred dollars up to \$7000.00 in the past couple of years. If you give money to these people, it is probable that you will never see this money again. Many of these scams originate from outside the United States.

If you have been scammed out of personal identifying information or money, please contact us immediately. We can try to reduce the amount of loss.

If you have any questions on whether something you receive is a scam, please fact check the information first. Call us if you have a question on something you have received. It is not a "waste of our time." It is a service we do to protect you from significant loss.

Annual Water Main Flushing Notice

Water main flushing will occur Monday, August 8th - Wednesday, August 10th. Flushing removes natural minerals such as iron and calcium, which are harmless, but may discolor water. Check your water for clarity before washing clothes. If water looks discolored, flush through with cold tap water only.

Lawn/Weed Control

Our ordinance – Chapter 130-3 states that weeds/grass/vegetation over 12" on a vacant lot and 8" on a developed lot constitutes a public nuisance. If it is determined that the height of weeds, grasses or other vegetation exceeds the limits, the DPW Staff will cut the noxious weeds, grasses or vegetation and charge the expenses to the property owner. We would like to thank the responsible property owners in the Village of Wrightstown for helping us make the community so beautiful.

Yard Waste

Branches and brush are chipped curbside on recycling Thursdays. Grass clippings, leaves, and garden waste are accepted at the compost site located on Van Dyke Street. Please do not place your yard waste in your garbage or recycling cart. Banned from WI landfills since 1993, placing yard waste in your refuse container violates WI State Statutes Chapter 287 and Wrightstown Municipal Code Chapter 165. Responsible dumping and efforts of tidiness are appreciated to ensure longevity of the site and to help with maintenance costs associated with the compost site. Contractors working in the village are not allowed to dump at the site. The solid waste container that is located at the site is for disposal of garbage bags used to transport leaves and grass clippings. Please empty all bags as it is unacceptable to leave grass clippings or leaves in bags.

Deduct Meters

Meters are available to customers in permanent or fixed installation as well as portable or temporary. These meters measure water that is used outside the home where sewer treatment of the water is not needed. This measured water amount is deducted from the sewer charge. There is an installation fee for permanent meters as well as a quarterly charge. The portable meters accrue charges by the month for the time it is rented. These meters are available upon request at the Utilities Department. Please contact the office at 920-532-0434 to pick up a portable meter or requirements for a permanent one.

Used Oil

Did you recently change your car oil at home? Maybe before you started up the lawnmowers for the season you filled with fresh oil but have a little left over and you don't know what to do with it? PLEASE DISPOSE OF OIL PROPERLY. Waste oil does NOT belong in the recycling/trash carts or landfills, not only does this harm the environment and waterways but could lead to fines or being held responsible for any clean-up cost. Recycling used oil allows us to continue to enjoy what many of us take for granted everyday – clean water. To put into perspective, just one gallon of used oil can contaminate 1 million gallons of water.

The Village of Wrightstown offers FREE used motor oil recycling for residents. Below are a few tips on properly disposing of used oil.

- 1. Prepare oil for recycling Transfer the oil into a clean, leak-proof container with lid using the original container the oil came in is preferred. Do not use containers that previously held household chemicals, and do not mix with solvents, other liquids or debris.
- *Motor oil that's been mixed with other fluids is NOT recyclable. If the oil was purposeful or even accidently mingled with other fluids such as gasoline, washer fluid or any other liquid (water included) it is no longer recyclable and will have to be handled as a hazardous material.
- 2. Mark container as "Used" waste oil to avoid any confusion.
- 3. Containers can then be dropped off at the village's Public Works Garage (420 Washington St.) near the service door in the front of the white garage. If you have oil containment containers you would like returned, please call the Public Works office to schedule a drop off appointment. Thank you for your cooperation, if you have any questions, please contact the Public Works Department.

Please keep grass clippings and leaves out of the streets!
