WI Lottery and Gaming Credit

This is a credit that provides direct property tax relief to qualifying taxpayers on their property tax bills. To qualify, you must be a Wisconsin resident, own a dwelling and use it as your primary residence as of the January 1 certification date of the year the property taxes are levied.



WISCONSIN

If you are eligible for the credit as of the January 1 certification date, but your property tax bill does not show the credit, you may claim the credit by completing an LC-100 form with the Village Clerk by January 31 after you receive your property tax bill. The 2022 credit amount was \$246.95. If you have any questions, please contact the Village Clerk's Office at 920-532-5567.

Police Department

Salvage Inspection

The Wrightstown Police Department offers many services to our community. One of these services is our Salvage Inspection Program.

When a vehicle is branded salvage due to hail damage, motor vehicle crash, flood damage, etc., the State of Wisconsin requires that the owner of the vehicle have the vehicle inspected by a certified law enforcement

inspector in order for it to be registered in the state. The Wrightstown Police Department is currently one of just 14 agencies statewide (the only one within Brown and Outagamie County) that has a certified inspector on staff and conducts these inspections.

We currently have one officer that is a certified inspector through the Department of Motor Vehicles. We provide inspection services throughout the year as the need arises.

Sump Pump Discharge

Reminder – From November 1st to March 31st every homeowner who has a sump pump discharge through a curb-cut or a hose that discharges directly to the curb & gutter will have to redirect the discharge elsewhere on the homeowner's proper-

Curbside Chipping/Yard Waste Disposal

The last day for curbside branch chipping is November 2nd. The Village's Yard Waste/Compost Site located at 409 Van Dyke St. will remain open for disposal of grass clippings, leaves, garden waste as well as branches/brush (no larger than 4" diameter) until weather permits. Please dispose of waste in proper bins as well as following the standard guidelines. Stumps/roots, fire wood, stones, dirt are not accepted. If using plastic bags or bins to transport waste, please empty and properly dispose of the bags.

The village is not able to offer curbside pickup of leaves, but watch in upcoming newsletters for curbside Christmas tree pick up dates.

Winter Reminders

The winter season will soon be here. As the temperatures start to drop and the snow falls, here are a few guidelines to keep in mind that will make the season safe for the communi-

- For pedestrian safety, all sidewalks are to be cleared of snow and ice by the property owner within 24 hours after a winter event.
- Shoveling, blowing, or plowing your snow into the street makes it unsafe for automobile traffic. It also violates Village ordinance and adds to the expense (your cost) of snow removal operations.
- Winter Street Parking From November 1st to March 31st, on-street parking is prohibited from 2:00am to 6:00am. Those found in violation are subject to a fine. If there would be a snow emergency declared in the Village of Wrightstown, there shall be no parking on Village streets until the snow emergency has been rescinded.
- If you see a village or county snow plow in your area, please yield to them. The snowplow operators are constantly maneuvering back and forth to clear the snow, and as a result, may not see you. Please give them the room they need to safely and efficiently clean the road. In addition, please do not park vehicles on the road after a snowfall. Plowing around a parked vehicle requires the operator to come back at a later time, which is not efficient use of your taxpayer dollars. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.
- Adopt a Hydrant The village has close to 300 fire hydrants throughout the community to help ensure our residents safety. We ask the community to partner with us by adopting a fire hydrant close to your home or business and keeping it clear of snow. In the event of a fire emergency, clear access to a hydrant is critical. Minutes count!
- For your protection, please remove all outside garden hoses and shut off your outside water taps to prevent freezing. It's a good practice to periodically check your exterior and interior water lines and fixtures to ensure no leaks are taking place. Any water losses on your property are your responsibility and will be billed accordingly, no adjustments will be considered.
- If you rented a seasonal deduct meter, please don't forget to return the meter back to the Water Utility department.
