Prescription Pain Killers and other Drugs

Opioids and other painkillers have a high tendency for abuse. Who is at greater risk? People who abuse prescription painkillers have a greater risk of addiction than people who take them as prescribed – but it is important to remember that the medication itself is addictive. Even those prescribed opiates can become addicted.

Making these items less available to those addicted will help prevent the use/abuse of those substances. There are many legitimate reasons people are prescribed medication. When the medication is no longer needed, it sits in the medicine cabinets thus available to those who have access to it to include, family, friends, visitors and burglars.

The Wrightstown Police Department (WPD) will dispose of your unused medications. All you need to do is drop them off at the Police Department during normal business hours. Monday through Thursday 8am – 4:30pm and Friday 8am – Noon.

WPD also hosts two Drug Take Back events each year. The next event will be held April 27, 2024 from 10:00am – 2:00pm at the police department where we will have officers and/or staff stationed here to collect your unused medications.

Curbside Brush Chipping

Curbside chipping will begin this year on Thursday, **April 4th** and occur every other Thursday, consistent with the curbside recycling schedule. Branches up to 4" in diameter are accepted for curbside chipping. Ends should be facing the curb, not obstructing the sidewalk, gutter or street. Brush piles are to be limited to 4' in height by 25' in length. Piles exceeding 4' x 25' will be chipped, and invoiced for the entire pile, at the current rate for labor and equipment with a half hour minimum charge, and fifteen minute increments thereafter. If you don't want to be charged for chipping, please ensure you are following the curbside chipping guidelines. Any brush cut by contractors will not be chipped by Village crews. Your contractor is responsible for disposing of any branches. Please contact DPW if you would like a load of wood chips.

Deduct Meters

Meters are available to customers in permanent or fixed installation, as well as portable or temporary. These meters measure water that is used outside the home where sewer treatment of the water is not needed. This measured water amount is deducted from the sewer charge. Examples when deduct meters are often useful; watering landscaping, or newly seeded grass and filling pools. There is an installation fee for permanent meters as well as a quarterly charge. The portable meters accrue charges by the month from the time it is rented. These meters are available upon request at the Utilities Department. Please contact the office at 920-532-0434 to pick up a portable meter or requirements for a permanent one. Reminder: 1,244 gallons of water must be used per month to recover the cost of the meter rental fee of \$15.00.

Facility Relocation

The Village of Wrightstown's Brush & Compost Facility has been relocated to **886 Mallard Rd.** (Van Dyke St. location is CLOSED). The new facilities' operations and guidelines will remain the same. We look forward to continuing this service to village residents at the new, larger location.

The Department of Public Works Garage has also been relocated to **886 Mallard Rd.** The DPW Garage and past waterworks building, at 420 Washington St. has been handed off to new ownership. You may have heard about the exciting addition to the villages River District, Gnarly Cedar Brewery! They will be renovating the building and expanding their brewery and taphouse to 420 Washington St. Due to this changeover, if you have used waste oil you are looking to properly dispose of, please drop off at the Wastewater Treatment Facility at 101 Washington St. during business hours. 101 Washington St. is the primary location for drop off of bulk waste, electronics, appliances and now, waste oil. Thank you all for your cooperation during these transitions.

Friendly Community Reminders

Trash/Recycling Carts: Carts are to be used for their purpose only, refuse in the **blue** garbage cart and recycling in the **green** cart (*mix recycling: paper, cardboard, recyclable plastics, glass, aluminum*). Please DO NOT dispose of the following items in your curbside carts as they are prohibited from landfills: grass clippings, branches or other yard waste, ashes or embers, hazardous or toxic waste, waste oil, gas or other like liquids, large batteries, concrete or bricks, medical or infectious waste, electronics, and tires. There are proper disposal options available to village residence for such items, please contact the Department of Public Works if you have questions.

Clean Up Pet Waste: With the mild winter to spring weather it sure has felt great to enjoy the outdoors, our furry friends included! The Wrightstown Community is grateful for many beautiful parks, trails and recreation areas that are pet friendly. Please be courteous to our neighbors, community and environment by picking up after your pet. Be sure to bag up pet waste and dispose of it in the TRASH to keep the community clean and prevent harmful waste from entering into our local waterways. Thank you for doing your part!

Annual Household Clean-up Day—Wednesday, May 22nd

- Please have your items at the curb by **5:00 am**, Wednesday **May 22nd**.
- Examples of items collected at no charge include: furniture, carpet, mattresses, appliances, push mowers, bikes, and other general household items.
- Mattresses and box springs must be sealed in a disposal bag before curbside collection.
- TV's, computer monitors and tires have additional recycling fees and require a curbside pick-up tag and payment. Tags can be purchased at the Village Hall or Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- Small amounts of construction waste (less than a pickup truck load) will be accepted. Nails and screws should be removed or pounded over.
- Please place any metal items on a separate pile.
- Glass items should be contained.
- Batteries will be collected at no charge.
- Items **not accepted:** cardboard, bulk recyclables, magazines, books, fuels, paints, thinners, solvents or hazardous chemicals.
- Please remember this service is for *Village Residents Only* and should not be used for other communities to drop off their items. If the volumes continue to increase due to additional garbage being brought in from outside village limits or residents not obeying guidelines, this no charge curbside service may be discontinued.

Every season the Waterboard Warriors put on two Learn To Ski Clinics. These clinics are open to people of ANY age who want to learn to ski with us! In years past we have had people ages 5-45! Everyone who comes to the clinic skis 2-3 times before the end of the night!

This year's Learn To Ski Clinics are Wednesday July 24th and Wednesday August 14th. The clinics cost \$40 per skier which includes pizza at the end of the night.
