Fun In The Parks

The Village of Wrightstown has many wonderful parks that offer a variety of amenities. While officers are out on patrol, it is nice to see them in use and people having fun. To keep our parks safe and enjoyable for our community, the Village does have certain ordinances in place.

- Parks are closed from 10pm – 6am
- Fireworks, and fires prohibited (Charcoal burners may be used in picnic area)
- No throwing of stones or missiles in or into the park, parkways, or waterways.
- No driving on sidewalks or grassy portions of the park.
- No interfering with permit holders
- Glass beverage containers prohibited
- Do not disturb, chase, or throw objects at animals or birds
- Dogs must be on a leash no longer than 7 feet
- Metal detectors prohibited without a permit.
- No swimming within 100 feet of the boat launch
- Vehicles with boat/kayak trailers parked in Mueller Park/Boat Launch must have a Brown County yearly boat permit (Can be obtained at Village Hall) or a \$6.00 Daily Boat permit from the boat launch. That permit must be properly filled out, fee paid, and receipt placed on drivers side dashboard visible from the windshield before you launch.
- No overnight docking of boats

Annual Water Main Flushing Notice

Water main flushing will occur Tuesday, August 20th - Thursday, August 22nd. Flushing removes natural minerals such as iron and calcium, which are harmless, but may discolor water. Check your water for clarity before washing clothes. If water looks discolored, flush through with cold tap water only.

Lawn/Weed Control

Our ordinance – Chapter 130-3 states that weeds/grass/vegetation over 12” on a vacant lot and 8” on a developed lot constitutes a public nuisance. If it is determined that the height of weeds, grasses or other vegetation exceeds ordinance limits, DPW Staff will cut the noxious weeds, grasses or vegetation and charge the expenses to the property owner. We would like to thank the responsible property owners in the Village of Wrightstown for helping us make the community so beautiful.

No Wipes Down the Pipes



The convenience and ease of cleaning wipes, paper toweling, disposable diapers etc. is ideal, however, putting these items down toilets may plug sewers and cause raw sewage to back up into your home. There are many products that often are marketed as “flushable”....unless it’s

toilet paper, it should NOT be flushed. All non-flushable items should be placed in the trash, including but not limited to: cleaning wipes, baby wipes, diapers, feminine hygiene products, facial tissues, paper toweling, hand wipes and facial tissues.

Please keep grass clippings and leaves out of the streets!

Summer Recycling

- It’s BBQ and camping season! Make recycling convenient by putting clearly labeled recycling bin by the trash can. Wrightstown accepts “mixed” recycling therefore cans, plastic, glass and cardboard can be combined. Don’t forget to recycle empty ketchup, mustard, BBQ sauce and other grilling favorites with twist-off lids. Rinse and Recycle!
- Reminder that cutlery, straws, plates, napkins, Styrofoam containers/coolers and paper toweling are NOT recyclable items; please dispose of these items in the trash.
- How do you dispose of propane and butane cylinders? If still in usable condition, many cylinders can be exchanged and refilled. Check with your local suppliers. If the cylinders are completely spent it is allowed to be placed in your garbage or brought to a scrap metal yard. Please do NOT recycle in your curbside cart. If there are chemicals in them, they can be brought to Brown and/or Outagamie Counties Hazardous Waste Centers.
- The sun is out, temperatures rise and you refresh with a beverage! Do your best to recycle your plastic, aluminum and glass containers while enjoying summer activities like: picnics, parties, swimming at the beach, sporting events, festivals and other outdoor activities.
- When gardening, unfortunately plastic plant containers are NOT an accepted plastic in our recycling program. Check with local garden retailers if they could reuse, get creative and find other uses for the pots or throw in trash. Reminder that mulch and potting soil bags don’t belong in your recycling bin.
- Mr. Handyman upgraded his power tools to start that big deck building project and he’s not sure how to dispose of the old batteries....Residents can bring their “junk” household batteries to Public Works for proper disposal during normal business hours. (Wastewater Treatment Plant/Administrative Building – 101 Washington St.) Please do NOT dispose of batteries with your recycling. Batteries and electronics are a fire hazard and should *never* go in recycling carts.
- It’s grass mowing time. So don’t let those grass clippings end up in the landfill! The EPA estimates that yard waste accounts for 18% of our landfills. Yard waste is *not* acceptable in trash or recycling carts. Wrightstown offers a convenient drop off location for your grass clippings and yard waste. The NEW compost site is located at 886 Mallard Rd.
